




Clay Center United Methodist Impact Report for CY2022

Thank you to Kathy Beougher & Diane Lykins and their great volunteers that work each month to provide food to our neighbor's in need. In 2022 we served 2,110 households, 4,609 individuals, 118,206 pounds acquired from Harvesters for a total of 98,505 meals distributed from the food acquired from Harvesters. You are truly making a difference here in Clay Center, Kansas.

Discipleship Guests-The Clay Center United Methodist Church was chosen as one of four churches in the Great Plains Conference to host representatives from the Discipleship Leadership Ministry Team including Rev. Children Learning About Yahweh

John Wesley prayed for revival, and it came to England, rescuing the country from the horrors of the French Revolution. Jonathan Edwards prayed, and a revival swept the American colonies. The Bible tells us in James 5:16 to confess our sins to one another and pray for one another, that we may be healed. God can heal us from our brokenness when we ask him through prayer. We have read about this truth in scripture and have seen it happen in history and our personal experiences. I, for one, am a living testimony to so many answered prayers. God has healed and answered many prayers in my life.



You may or may not have heard or seen media coverage of what happened last month at Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky. On February 8th,

several college students attended their usually scheduled Wednesday morning chapel service at Hughes A uditorium. They did not know what God had in store for them. The preacher that morning spoke about what the love of God looks like and the pouring out of that love. At the end of his sermon, a young man stood up and confessed his addictions and sins among those present. The chapel service continued with more people confessing their sins, singing songs, worshiping, giving their lives to Christ, and students at the altar praying. This powerful service awakened college students' hearts at Asbury, spreading to over 20 other places/campuses in the country. As I write this newsletter article, the chapel service at Asbury has been going on for over 250 hours. Through social media, young people share about this revival and the Good News of Jesus Christ. The TikTok hashtags #AsburyRevival and #Asbury_Revival had over 100 million views. Yes, God can even use TikTok to bring glory to Himself! One of the journalists commented on this revival and said, "Gen Z is on fire for God!" I like that line. Our youth belong to this 'Gen Z' generation, and they are on fire for God.



If we win the spiritual battles across our country but neglect our youth, all our progress will be undone in a generation. Therefore, young people today need our support and earnest prayers. However, our youth do not just need more prayer; they need our united prayer. Our hopes and dreams for this generation may be realized with a greater degree of genuine, unified prayer. I love doing ministry with Gen Z's. I love seeing our young people read scripture, and I love seeing them share their testimonies; I love doing band meetings with them and seeing them participate in our worship services here at CCUMC. I also love seeing how our parents and grandparents support the spiritual nurturing of our young people in different ways here at church. Thank you to all our parents and grandparents for joining hands with the church in discipling our youth. Thank you to all that continue to pray for our young people.
