



Lahaina United Methodist Church, Maui



Though a sign survived, the Lahaina United Methodist Church sanctuary was destroyed by the August 8 wildfires that swept through the town of Lahaina on the Hawaiian island of Maui.

The Lahaina UMC dates back to

1896 when a missionary from Japan arrived to minister to Japanese workers in the sugar cane and fruit plantations. The sanctuary that was lost in the August 8 fire was built in 1922 on Lahaina's Front Street. Along with the sanctuary being destroyed was an area used by a preschool. Their parsonage survived.






